Near Eastern Studies Major Requirements

Applying to the Major

Prerequisite: Prospective majors must have successfully completed one NES course (language courses count).

Language:

To complete the major, students must successfully complete two years of one Near Eastern language or one year of two Near Eastern languages. Please indicate language(s) you plan to study.

Effective January 2016: In addition to the language requirement, eight courses are required to complete the major. Of these eight courses, at least three must be at the 3000 level or above, and one must be a Research Seminar. Research Seminar courses are designated with NES-RS in the Courses of Study. If you have taken a course that you feel meets the criteria but is not marked as NES-RS, please contact the department for approval.

Core courses:

NES 4560: Theory & Method in Near Eastern Studies is a required course. Students that have not taken NES 4560 prior to declaring the NES major are encouraged to sign up for it as soon as it is offered.

In addition to NES 4560, students must successfully complete one of the following:

- NES 2651: Judaism, Christianity, and Islam
- NES 2676: Holy War, Crusade and Jihad from Antiquity to Present
- NES 2754: Wondrous Literatures of the Near East

Historical Breadth:

Three courses must fulfill temporal breadth, defined as any one course whose chronological parameters fall within the following periods. College of Arts & Sciences Requirements

- First Year Writing Seminars (two courses).
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- Foreign Language requirement
 - a. A Cornell language course numbered 2000 or above, or non-introductory class conducted in a foreign language
 - b. Or eleven credits of study in a single foreign language
 - Nine distribution courses, three of which are satisfied with a major in humanities or social sciences and four of which are satisfied with a major in sciences
 - 15 credits of elective courses outside of the major
 - Physical education: two 1-credit, non-academic courses required in addition to passing the swim test.
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Courses, Credit and Residency Requirements

- Minimum of 34 courses (must receive a grade equivalent to C or better in any given course)
- Total of 120 credits, of which 100 must be A&S
- Residence: 8 full-time semesters unless exempted

Important Note

All courses for the major must be taken for a letter grade (No S/U) and students must pass the course with a grade of C or better. No course may be used to satisfy two requirements. A maximum of two independent studies may be applied to the major; a maximum of two non-cross listed courses may be applied to the major; a maximum of two courses may receive credit for more than one major. A maximum of 15 credits of relevant, departmentally approved course work take overseas or at another university may be applied to the major. Arts and Sciences requires that students must carry a minimum of 15 credits during a semester abroad.
